

Arch's Thunder Basin Coal Company Earns Pro Patria Award for Support of Military Employees in Wyoming

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GILLETTE, Wyo., June 10, 2013 -- Thunder Basin Coal Company, a subsidiary of Arch Coal, Inc. (NYSE:ACI), has been named a recipient of the 2013 Pro Patria Award, the highest award given to an employer by the Wyoming's Committee for Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve (ESGR), an agency of the U.S. Department of Defense.

ESGR volunteers provide free education, consultation and, if necessary, mediation for employers of Guard and Reserve employees.
